#### **Local Venues** No 9 BOW HILL BARN

Otterholes, now the Park, was part of Bow Hill Farm, farmed by Mr W M Ingham until 1912 when Mr J W Hartley (late of Sutton Hall 1850-1909) made a gift of the land to the village. It was opened as part of the park, there was also a garden occupied by Mr Bailey Haigh, landlord of the nearby Black Bull

History tells us that two Sutton men who fought at Flodden Field had a bow and axe. Being near the stream, lots of willows would grow, suitable for bows and arrows.

Over the years the barn has had many uses. When residents had to repair the local highways, stone knapping took place in the cobbled yard. Horses that were stabled there hauled wool and yarn to and from Kildwick Station. When T & M Bairstows became owner, an AEC lorry with hard tyres, driven by Mr J H Ridsdale had its home there. I also remember votes from political elections at Holme Bridge School were taken and counted at the premises. (Extracts from A Home Spun Yarn, £5.95 by Doris Riley.)

Mr Wm Riley, stone mason and builder became the next owner and occupier, followed by Mr H Riley (THREE HALF CROWNS) repair and cycle dealer for many years; and on his retirement by several other businesses.

Substantial and well built with stone, the barn has been converted into two dwellings, the backs facing south-west making them sun-traps, with stone garages and dry stone walled gardens.

#### **Safer Craven**

The Craven Crime Reduction Partnership launched its Crime and Drugs Reduction Strategy 2005-2008, at its AGM on Tuesday 21 June 2005.

The strategy highlights ten of the Partnershipís identified objectives for the next three years, these include: A) To reduce levels of Anti-Social Behaviour

- B) To reduce Domestic Burglary
- C) To reduce Vehicle Crime
  D) Reduce levels of Drug & Alcohol related crime
- E) To reduce levels of Violent Crime
  F) Reduce Serious Injury and Fatal Injury
  accidents
- G) Reduction in Domestic Abuse Incidents

The partnership aims to address these issues through its Local Problem Solving Groups who are based in the five main areas of the district. Each group consists of local Police Officers, Parish Council members, LA members and members of the community, all of whom are in a position to make a difference. Household Security is the focus of a current North Yorkshire Police initiative. Thieves are opportunists and so you need to ensure you don't offer any opportunities. When you go out, always lock the door and close the windows - even if you are just going out for a short time. Lock your doors when you are in the house. When going to bed check all doors and downstairs windows are locked. Use timers for lights if you need to be away from home overnight. They will create the impression that someone is in.

- 1. The bus shelter at the Village Hall has finally been erected and it will be appreciated when the bad weather is upon us (see photo). County Councillor Phil Barrett is to be thanked for the support he has given in ensuring that this project reached completion.
- 2. The conversion of the toilet block next to the Black Bull into a youth meeting room is going ahead but planning and legal matters must be sorted out before building work can take place. No doubt this is frustrating for the young people but nevertheless they are looking to the future by attending project meetings and raising money.
- 3. The new Community Police are making themselves known in the village and residents are pleased to see them about. Sadly we are still seeing some mindless behaviour in the Park but generally there is a positive atmosphere in the village.
- 4. A new "state of the art" mower and attachments have been bought for maintaining the Park bowling green and already reports are that not only has the green improved in standard but also the bowling!
- 5. Many people enjoy a quiet stroll through the Clough, which is a marvellous amenity owned by the village. New signs are being erected at the entrances with a list of "don'ts" which is intended to remind users to respect and help maintain this quiet atmosphere.
- 6. As will have been seen recently in the Craven Herald, new plans for the development of Greenroyd Mill have been put forward. The Parish Council requested a meeting with the architect who went through the plans in some detail and it was gratifying to see that most of the criticisms and submissions made at the public meeting in November had been taken into account. The Parish Council has made a written submission to the Planning Committee of Craven District Council, which will be considering the new plans at a meeting in the near future.

The Village Hall was closed for much of August whilst the old 80 year old heating system was ripped out and a completely new system installed. Grants were received from the County, District and Parish councils along with a donation from Sutton Village Committee and substantial funding from Yorventure through the land fill tax system.

The new energy efficient system will be zone controlled and thus more economic to run, will provide temperature regulated water in wash basins and ensure a safe environment for the youngsters with the use of low temperature radiators throughout. The work necessitated some decorating being carried out, so pop into the Hall and check out the changes.
