## Parish Council NEWS

The previous three months have been as busy and demanding as usual but there are three items that may be of particular interest;

The village owns a substantial plot of land situated between the allotments on Bridge Street and the beck. Over the years, it has become overgrown and often used as a dumping ground. Recently the land has been cleared and the trees pruned which has allowed a group of post-16 students from South Craven School to inspect the plot and plan the establishing of a Wild Life Garden which in future years will be used by their school and the pupils of the two village primary schools. The Council is keen to encourage the use of this land by the young people and we look forward to reporting on the progress of the project.

The recently established scheme for sponsoring flower gardens in the park is up and running and you may have noticed the plaques that have been put in place. Any private individual or business interested in sponsoring a plot can contact the clerk for details.

Denise Emmott, the new Clerk, started work in July and is now well settled in and proving to be a great asset to the Council. This past month she has been instrumental in Council members reviewing and up-dating procedural and financial regulations as well as ensuring that all health and safety matters affecting Council employees are in order. ## Sutton Village Committee

Earlier this year we sadly lost one of our helpers, Mr Robin Woolfe. Following his funeral his wife, Val, very kindly donated the collection from the ceremony to the Village Committee. After discussing the matter and referring back to Val, we decided the committee would pay for the clearance of an area at the bottom of the park and use Val's donation to purchase new plants. The area was cleared in October and the committee, together with Mark the park keeper, consulted Johnsons of Whixley who compiled a list of suitable trees and shrubs.

The committee is kick starting the project with a selection from the list worth £380. As there have been several enquiries about this, and offers to donate a plant, a plan will be displayed in the park pavilion with a list of the selection and prices. Donors please note that only plants from the selection will be used and orders will be taken on a first come first served basis. Prices range from £2.50 for the smallest (to be planted in groups), £7.50 for the larger shrubs, up to around £85 for the larger trees.

## Local Venues No 10. The Vineries or 'Peg & Lag Shop'

W J R Thompson (Woodturners) Ltd

Established in 1862 by Mr William Thompson, a village joiner & undertaker, at Rose Mount - I believe a windmill provided power. In later years his nephew Walter, then his brother John Robert joined him. Walter lived in an end terrace house at Ash Grove, John Robert at the 'Butterfly House'. Their families followed into the business. The brothers expanded the business - a Sutton man invented the Dobby for the weaving trade, and William made the first lag - hence the name 'Peg & Lag Shop'.

They moved to the Vineries at Bull Common in Holme Lane, still in Sutton-in-Craven. Grapes had been grown there & the metal arched vineries were still in use as sheds when the firm closed, approximately 2003/2004.

Local people were employed there, some for most of their working lives. The firm was a benefactor to local organisations until it closed, Mr Walter gave a children's slide to the park.

Farmers went with horse & cart to collect sawdust and wood sweepings, the sawdust was used for bedding cattle in winter. This was later thought to cause mastitis and given up. Among the sweepings were bits for kindling, small pieces of turned wood, knotted yo-yos, diabolos etc.

The firm was known over the world for its small turned products. A rumour to me was that the refurbished Orient Express had toilet roll holders made by them. Their yard was filled with huge tree trunks, some bought locally.

The history of this prestigious firm would make a good project for students to study - another village industry and employment gone.

To the readers of my column, residents and Suttoners all over the world who receive the Village News, a very Happy Christmas and Serene New Year. Thanks to the many people in the village who speak to me, saying they enjoy the column and reminisce interesting bits of 'Local History'.

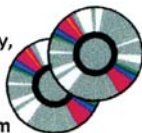
