Funday will kick off with the procession at 12noon weaving its way round the village before leading into the park.

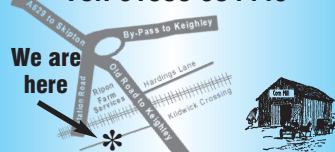

Village Committee donations

As you may already be aware, the Village Committee works very hard, at a number of events that allow funds to be raised. These funds are then donated to organisations in the village to allow them to undertake some projects which will benefit that organisation. Sutton Art Club has received a £250.00 donation to replace the doors on their storage area, as did the CofE Friends Association, for the same purpose. Tommy Tots has been provided with a donation of £200.00 to assist with the purchase of new tables for the Children. The Friends of Sutton CP School have been donated £250.00 for improvements to the playground, a project that the children have been working on. Sutton Village Hall has recently benefitted from a very healthy £8078.20 donation, which has been used

to provide 140 new chairs, and a chair trolley, with 2 new tables to match those in the meeting room, and also the replacement of the wooden fire doors, which are now Upvc doors. A large cheque was presented by David Harrison Young, Village Committee Chairman, to Garry Petersen, the Village Hall Chairman, see photo below. Villagers from Sutton in Craven help to generate these funds, by attending and taking part in the various events that are hosted by the Committee, such as FunDay, Bonfire Night, and the events that are hosted in the Village Hall. Do your bit for Sutton, attend the events, enjoy the events, and spend some money. By doing this you will be helping organisations in Sutton, to do great things.

The Youth Facility

In 2006 it was recognised that Sutton in Craven suffered from Anti Social Behaviour, caused mainly by the young people living within the village.

Safer Craven Community Partnership were made aware of this and agreed to form a problem solving group to see how best to tackle this issue.

The group identified that facilities for young people in Sutton, were minimal, particularly after dark when the park closed. The young people themselves were consulted who stated that all they is a place to meet their friends.

The group soon identified a possible site within the centre of the village, in the form of the disused public toilets. The building would obviously require some alterations to convert it into a drop in centre.

Subsequent enquiries showed that the building construction was not suitable for the intended purpose and would need to be demolished, and a new purpose built building erected. Funds were not available to provide for this. It came to our attention that a corner of a field owned by a local farmer could be made available for use, either by refurbishing the building that was already in situ, or by placing a portable building within the field. After overcoming several obstacles the search ended and with a lot of hard work, the drop in Centre is now in place on Holme Lane.

We see this facility as a positive initiative to provide a service for young people where quite often they are forgotten about in terms of facilities. The Drop in Centre is a building that young people can pop into as and when it is open. At the moment that is Mondays and Thursdays 7pm to 9pm.

It is staffed at these times and some light refreshments may be available. The unit houses young people whilst they play games, or sit chatting to their friends, all activities are supervised.

Young people can find out about planned activities from notice boards, via leaflets provided and the Youth workers. The Youth workers are qualified at dealing with any issues that may arise through conversation with the young people, this facility offers a unique opportunity for the youngsters, who might be experiencing difficulties in their personal life, allowing advice to be provided by somebody outside of the family unit.

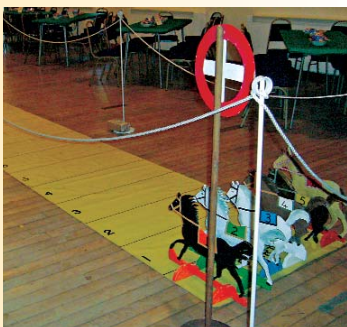

I have been a police officer for 6 years, prior to which I served 7 years in the armed forces. I have spent the majority of my service with the Wiltshire Constabulary, my time being divided between uniform policing as a response driver, and working undercover on the Crime Targeting Team, dealing with drug offences, burglaries and public order offences.

I have recently transferred to the North Yorkshire Police and have adopted the role of neighbourhood police officer for Sutton-In-Craven. My responsibilities are to deal with community issues in Sutton-In-Craven such as anti social behaviour, traffic and criminal offences.

My aim is to maintain a close contact with the local residents in order for me to understand needs and issues within the community. I also hope to develop a closer liaison with neighbourhood watch coordinators. I will hold regular 'surgeries' in and around the village



which will be advertised in shops, pubs and on the notice boards. The surgeries will enable residents to come and have a chat, raise concerns or ask questions. All information will be received in confidence.

Sutton-In-Craven is a peaceful village with a close knit community and as in all of Craven, does not suffer from a high volume of crime, however, we do receive complaints of anti-social behaviour. I would encourage residents to report all such problems to the police, not to suffer in silence and where possible identify those who are responsible for spoiling the quality of life in and around Sutton-In-Craven.
