The first thing that I would like to say is a big thank you to everyone on the committee for all their efforts and hard work all through the year and it is down to them that all of the events the committee stage - Valentines Party, Funday, Halloween Party, Bonfire Night and New Years Eve Party are the great successes they are, due to the enthusiasm, hard work, and dedication shown by the small committee of dedicated members.

I would like to add a big thankyou to all the volunteer friends of the committee, whom without we would find it impossible to stage these large scale events. To the villagers who so kindly donate raffle and tombola prizes and also to Graham @ H.B. Clark for his generous sponsorship and donations throughout the year.

Alongside the large events done for the village we also run in excess of 30 bars at the village hall, mobile/outside bars, Race Nights - we did 4 last year 2 in Sutton, 1 in Skipton and 1 in Silsden, all of which raise funds for our village

I would like to take this opportunity to say that All the staff working any event whether it's Funday, Bonfire Night, the Party Nights, Race evenings outside bars or bars in the village hall - All Who Work Completely Free of Charge to benefit our village. Yes I know it's hard to believe that people work long hours for Free, but trust me it's True.

The year all in all has been very successful - all the New Year, Valentines and Halloween party nights have been complete sell outs, we are privileged to have such top class acts perform in our village.

The Committee bar facility has seen a large increase in bookings, the welcoming of the New Bar structure has already raised the profile and professionalism we can offer with this service. This in turn has seen a large increase in bookings for the village hall. This coming year the committee hope to decorate the bar room to complement the fantastic new structure and link in with the overall improvements done in the hall

The race nights are picking up momentum and again we are doing more bookings helping other individuals and organisations to raise money for their own causes.

The Funday has gone from strength to strength with new attractions, bigger procession and our cream tea marquee was very popular. So I would like to thank everyone who supported the committee.

A downside to our year was the Bonfire and Fireworks display which made a Huge loss which has put it in jeopardy of not going ahead which would be a great shame, unless the donations on the gate prove to be more generous. The committee has decided to give it another year to see what happens. So if you want it to continue, then show your support in the buckets for it!

And lastly to the end of the year and the Christmas lights which again brighten up the village over the festive season. This is a project both myself and the rest of the committee are hoping to expand as lamppost changes allow.

Also I feel I must point out that despite popular opinion the Village Committee and all the events we provide throughout the year like Funday and Bonfire Night are purely funded by your donations and the hard work of our members and volunteer helpers who work tirelessly for Free.

Sutton in Craven Village Committee Treasurers Report for Year Ending 31/01/09

The Village Committee, has once again had a The Village Committee, has once again had a very busy year, providing some excellent events throughout the year. These events have all been of a very high standard, and also very well attended. Our Bar in the Village Hall goes from strength to strength, having been renewed this year. As the Bar has to be a removable piece of equipment, we had the new bar designed as a number of units which all lock together, and are mounted on wheels to allow the movement of these units. The Bar really does look fantastic, and is so much easier to use, allowing us to offer a very good service to anybody who wanted to hire Sutton Village Hall, and wished to have a bar service with their event. A good range of draught lagers and bitter are available, along with a very full range of other complimentary drinks such as wines, spirits, bottled cold drinks, and soft drinks for those wishing to keep a clear head. The bar is a very important assett of the Village Committee, as it produces a very high level of the Village Committees funds

Once again Funday was held on Father's Day, and the weather held for most of the day, making it a very enjoyable event, big crowds turned out to attend the event, which allowed all of the stalls and fundraisers to take some money on the day. As a first, the Village Committee allowed all Sutton based organisations a free pitch, giving them a chance to make more from the day, to benefit their organisations. The parade was very well attended, possibly the longest parade seen in Sutton, with 2 bands, and a great variety of other entrants, and loads of colour. Once again, having the Park as the

main focal point of the Funday, and Thompsons Field for the bigger, scarier rides worked very well, especially as it was possible to close off a part of the road, so that it was safer for everybody to cross between the two sites.

Bonfire Night was staged once again on Thompsons Field, and this being the second year on this site, we knew more of what was needed to be able to provide a safe event, with attractions to pull in a arge crowd. To some degree we were fortunate with the weather that we had, there was some rain, which made it difficult to get the fire started, but the Fireworks were fantastic, and enjoyed by everyone that I spoke to. It seems a shame, that after such a good night, and with the attendance that we had on the field, that the donations made by the public, were minimal, an average of 40p per person. T event actually made a loss of £2500.00, which is a travesty considering the very hard work that was put into it by members and helpers of the Village Committee. This leads to decisions having to be made about next year, should the event be changed to a fixed entry charge, should the event be cancelled like so many other communities have done, or do we carry on as we have, and hope that more money is donated by the attendees.

The Village Newsletter continues to be delivered through the doors of Sutton in Craven, with the great support of the Businesses that advertise within the publication, and who pay for the cost of it. This year is possibly the first time that the newsletter has been able to break even, allowing the publication and delivery charges to be completely covered by the advertisers fees This bright and colourful publication, providing news of ongoing events in Sutton, from the many organisations based in Sutton. I hope that this success continues well into the future. Our distribution is currently at 1500, which will soon have to increase to allow some spare copies to be provided to our advertisers, and also to cover the growth in the village.

The Village Committee in Sutton is a very small group of people, who are very active in promoting Sutton in Craven. A small village, held in awe during the Christmas period because of the wonderful Christmas lights that hang around the Village, making everything look beautiful and very restive. Some bigger Towns cannot compete with what we have. This same small group of people also work hard serving on, in the bar in Sutton Village Hall, where much of the committees profits are made, which allow things like the Christmas lights to be purchased, and also to cover such things as the loses of the Bonfire night. How nice it would be for a greater pool of volunteers to be available, who would be able to assist with just a few of the events that are put on, to allow the few that always do, to have some time off.

With Sutton Village Hall becoming a busier place, due to the bookings that are taken for parties and events requiring the bar, 2009 is going to be another busy year for the Village Committee, please come and help us to make it a great 2009.
